I AM who I AM, God says to Moses. And throughout the Lenten season we have been hearing Jesus say, I AM gate, vine, bread, light, shepherd... Each time we discover more about who God is, we also see more clearly who we are - and who we are not. Nothing is more important. Everything we say, do, think, feel is tied to our identity - the story we tell ourselves about ourselves.

It is hard to find our proper place within God's good creation. We either think too much of ourselves, or not enough. We tell our own story as if we are the hero - or the victim. Holy Week can help with that. It tells the central story of our faith.

As we hear the stories of Jesus' passion - Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter morning - it is clear that Jesus is the hero, giving his life willingly. He is not a victim - and neither are we. We have choices to make. As we claim this story as OUR central story, we begin to see ourselves in Peter, Judas, Mary, Thomas... in their weakness and in the power they find through faith in the risen Christ.

Holy Week shows us the true depth of God's great love for us. And that is where our story - our true identity - begins and ends. You are WHO GOD SAYS YOU ARE! Beloved. Forgiven. Empowered. Now and forever! +Pastor Mary



<u>Holy Week Worship</u> begins Palm Sunday, March 28, and continues through Easter Day, April 4. This week is one, long service leading God's people through the central story of our faith.

Palm Sunday Worship (March 28) will include blessing of palms and Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. We'll also hear Jesus say "I AM the Good Shepherd. Friendship children and youth will tell the story of Jesus' passion. If you are worshipping online, pick up palms and communion from the Parish House porch anytime from March 25 - 28.

Maundy Thursday Worship (April 1) – including foot-washing, communion, and stripping of the altar - will be posted online by noon. Have a bowl of water and a towel to wash hands or feet and pick up communion elements from the church or use bread/wine or juice that you have at home.

Good Friday Worship (April 2) – will be posted online by noon. We give thanks to Patrick and our choir members for leading us through this difficult, but important part of the passion story.

Easter Sunday Worship (April 4) – will celebrate the resurrection at all three services (see times and info on the next page). While we will miss the sunrise service and Easter breakfast, we give thanks that we are able to gather in person to rejoice in the good news of God's victory over sin and death.

<u>In person worship on Sundays</u> is at 8:00, 9:15 & 10:30am. Masks are required at 8:00 & 10:30, and recommend-

ed at 9:15. The 8:00 and 9:15 service is broadcast to the parking

lot. The 8:00 am service is livestreamed to Facebook and posted to YouTube later in the day. The link to all services is on our church website – Friendshiptaylorsville.org. If you know of someone who



is not able to worship in person or online, please call the church office so that we can deliver DVDs.

The Sunday after Easter (April 11) - worship will be ONLINE ONLY. There will be no in-person worship. After Easter gatherings, we will take some time apart to ensure that we can be together safely. The NC Synod Staff will offer worship which will be posted to our Facebook page, YouTube and Website. In person worship will resume on April 18.

CREW Holy Week - As Easter approaches, CREW is going to deep dive into Holy Week and the major events back during Jesus' time. This Holy Week we are going to meet each night to discuss the significance of each event.

- Thursday April 1st 6:00 pm: Maundy Thursday Last Supper
- Friday April 2nd 6:00 pm: Good Friday Crucifixion
- <u>Saturday April 3rd 6:30 pm:</u> Holy Saturday Reflection of Lent & Prepare for Easter
- Sunday April 4th 6:30 am: Easter Sunday Sunrise Devotion

CREW will meet at the cross each night. On Saturday we will meet around sunset and on Sunday we will meet at sunrise. Each day will include a time of reflection and devotion. Transition Time-Line

The following time-line was developed by the Transition Team and reviewed by Church Council

<u>February - May</u> – Transition Team gathers information for Congregational Study, which will provide information about Friendship Lutheran to the N.C. Synod and shape the Call process

In February, focus on Existing Ministries

In March, focus on Future Mission

In April, focus on Pastoral Leader Gifts

In May, report the Congregational Study results to Council and Congregation

June - August - Assemble Call Committee

<u>June – July</u> – Nominating Committee recruits 6 candidates for the Call Committee

<u>August</u> – Nominations for Call Committee are received from the congregation

<u>September 12</u> – Congregational Meeting to elect Call Committee (6 people)

September – Call Committee Trained by N.C. Synod Staff

October – Call Committee begins interviewing pastoral candidates

The process of interviewing potential pastoral candidates will continue until the Call Committee identifies a primary candidate. The primary candidate will then meet the Church Council and the congregation. Eventually, the congregation will vote to extend a call to a pastor. If the vote is affirmative, the pastoral candidate is given time to reflect and respond to the invitation. While who the Call committee is interviewing will need to be kept confidential, the congregation will be kept informed of where the church is in the call process.

February 9, 2021 Regular Meeting in Person

President Mary Ann Icenhour called the meeting to order. Dennis Rhyne shared a devotion and led prayer.

Motion by Dennis Rhyne; seconded by Wade Cline to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on January 12, 2021. Motion carries. Treasurer's report for the month was distributed.

TEAM REPORTS:

Administration - Sandra Icenhour

<u>Care</u> – Amy Palmer - Wade Cline shared plans for a drive thru/delivery appreciation meal for Emergency Personnel on March 13. Next blood drive will be April 11.

<u>Learn</u> – Hannah Bostian – Plans are being made to take the kids ice skating in Newton. Protocols will be in place there. Bus guidelines will be considered if the bus is used for this trip or if parents will provide their own transportation. Sandra Icenhour and her team will work on the guidelines for bus use. The team was asked to set guidelines for an egg hunt and get them back to Pastor Mary for council review.

<u>Worship</u> -Teresa Birchfield – A team meeting is set for February 22 to discuss Easter plans and Patrick's evaluation.

<u>Rusha Austin Scholarship</u> – Starr Lynn Smith – The team is getting organized with the guidelines. Packets are available for pick up in the church office.

Preschool - Pat Payne

Building & Grounds (BAG) – Jason Icard & Eric Frye – The BAG team makes a motion to enter into an agreement with Conover Roofing for the repair of the roof of the Church building, so we can get on their production calendar. No funds will be used until the congregation has authorized

the expenditure through a congregational vote. The motion comes from a standing team, so it requires no second. Motion carries. Plans will be made to conduct a congregational meeting and a congregational mailing to share details.

<u>Technology</u> – Steven Deal – Pastor Tim shared John Adair's report on the training for the media. Mel Jolly and Wade Cline are trained to handle the live streaming and recording. John has purchased the iPad and an external hard drive for church use.

<u>Transition</u> – Leah Hayes – The team met January 25 and have identified ways to engage the congregation on the first topic of what they feel is the most important current ministries. The church will be asked to complete a card and return at each church service for a couple Sundays, by responding in the comments for those watching on Facebook or calling the church office. A timeline for the team was shared with council.

PASTORS REPORT:

Pastor Mary shared that mid-week Lenten service have already begun to be taped for online watching. She will be meeting with the Preschool Team soon to help get things lined up for changes coming in August 2021. All Team liaisons are asked to get their team members to Dana as soon as possible. These need to be to her by the March meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Pastors asked for a more defined policy for ice/snow weather. Plans moving forward, if needed, would be to allow the Pastors and President Mary Ann Icenhour to decide by 7 pm on Saturday evening if inclement weather is in the forecast. If it is safe for some travel, a 10 am service would be held in the fellowship hall with mask required, bring your own chairs and live stream the service. Council feels this is currently the best option.

OLD BUSINESS:

The TV/stand for the kids has been purchased.

The exercise class with Taylor Payne is still in the planning stages.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned with prayer.
