Pastor's Word

Dear Friends,

Recently I was reflecting on what makes a congregation vibrant, full of life and energy. How do we measure the life of a church? Is it the number of programs or events going on each week? Is it reflected in Sunday School attendance or worship numbers? Is it reflected financially; how much is given to support the ministries of the congregation and how much does the congregation share with others outside its walls? These measurements or numbers are what often drive our view of church's health. We base decisions on the numbers of "bodies & bucks" but is this really the best determination of what the Holy Spirit is doing in our midst? We like the numbers because they seem like facts, like hard data and we are used to businesses being evaluated this way but is there a better approach? The problem with relying too heavily on numbers like these is that while we can compare them year to year or week to week, they don't reflect what is really going on in the daily lives of God's people or what is happening in the spiritual life of a congregation.

So how do we measure whether people are growing in faith? Ideally worship and Sunday school or bible study attendance is a reflection that people are growing spiritually but without further information it is difficult to determine how deep the growth is or if it is even there at all. Because the reality is that some people attend or give out of a sense of obligation-to look good or because its what they were taught they need to do to fit in. How different it is when attendance and giving flows from a heart on fire for Jesus, a desire to grow spiritually within one's self and to share in God's mission in the world! Now that is something to measure! That reflects a church's health and vitality!

It is easy to fall into the trap of counting numbers without thinking deeper about what is really going on in the spiritual lives of people. It's easier than engaging in conversation with someone about ways they are living out their faith daily and ways they are growing closer to the Lord. But I think it's more important that people become more faithful disciples through a church's ministry than the raw data of "bodies and bucks". That's what I want to evaluate the health of Friendship Lutheran Church on.

Sometimes we miss seeing what God is up to because we aren't looking closely enough but more often it's because we aren't looking in the right place. The right place to look is in the hearts of the people who make up Friendship Lutheran. When I look at those hearts I am encouraged. I am excited. Because what I see there is God's love and grace and the Spirit of God dwelling there. And from my perspective, I see growth here. From the couple that calls me up on Sunday evening with a question about one of the weekly bible texts we publish to the young person wrestling with how to be faithful to God's word when it seems the world around them is always tempting them to live differently to the young adult who wants to start a ministry here at church so others can grow closer to Jesus to the older person who faithfully sends notes to or makes phone calls encouraging and praying for people on the prayer list to those who go out into the community and to foreign countries to be the light of Christ to those who plan fundraisers for people in need to the person who shares their faith with a co-worker and then invites her to worship to those who go into prisons to proclaim God's Word and see lives transformed; all these are reflections of the Spirit at work here in this place at this time! I could go on and on, there are so many other ways that I see people growing spiritually. What do you see? How can you help our church grow spiritually?

My challenge to you this month is to think about all the ways the Spirit is moving in your own life, in the lives of others around you, and in this church. And then tell someone what you see! Share the ways God is at work and together we will proclaim the coming of the Kingdom of God! Let's move beyond simple number crunching to a more profound and deeper evaluation. If you want to talk more about this, let me know. I would love to hear your stories and see what God is up to in your life. And who knows, maybe we can start telling those stories regularly in worship to encourage and challenge one another even more!

Be blessed, be loved, be restored by the Holy Spirit this summer season of Pentecost.
